NAS OCEANA INSTRUCTION 10127.1H

Subj: FLIGHT CLOTHING FOR AIRCREW AND NON-AIRCREW PERSONNEL

Ref: (a) COMNAVAIRLANTINST 10127.5B
(b) Naval Supply Manual, Volume II, Paragraph 25842

1. Purpose. To set procedures to be followed for issue, control and receipt of flight clothing for aircrew and non-aircrew flight personnel.

2. Cancellation. NASOCEANAINST 10127.1G. Because of numerous revisions, paragraph markings have been omitted.

3. Scope. This instruction applies to all station departments that have aircrew and non-aircrew personnel ordered to duty involving flying under the provisions of reference (a).

4. Background. Reference (b) provides instructions for procurement, stocking, issue and return of flight clothing and equipment for personnel who are in a flying status.

5. Responsibilities. The Air Operations Maintenance Division (AOMD) Officer is responsible for procuring and maintaining flight clothing. In addition to complying with reference (a), he/she shall ensure that quantities of flight clothing maintained do not exceed the limitations of the NAVAIR 00-35-QH-2 Allowance List.

6. Procedures. Personnel who are on officer or enlisted flight orders are eligible to draw required flight clothing on an individual-custody basis. The following specific procedures will be adhered to by all personnel utilizing flight clothing.

a. Individuals holding flight clothing on individual custody are responsible for the security and proper care of said clothing. Loss or damage, other than normal wear and tear, shall be investigated by the applicable division officer. If it is determined that custodial negligence was involved, disciplinary action shall be taken.

b. Replacement of worn flight clothing shall be on an exchange basis, unless otherwise determined by cognizant authority.

c. Flight clothing shall be worn by aircrew members and by individuals engaged in flight or flight-related duties. Flight clothing may be worn outside of organizational spaces per current

Chief of Naval Operations, Commander, Naval Air Force, U.S.
Atlantic Fleet and Regional Commander's policies.

d. Transferring personnel, or those who no longer maintain a requirement for flight clothing, shall promptly return all flight gear to AOMD Paraloft as indicated in paragraphs 7c and 7d below.

e. When required, personnel holding flight clothing on individual custody shall return it to AOMD Paraloft for inspection/inventory.

f. Authorized personnel shall present a DD Form 1348 requisition document, accompanied by their Naval Air Training and Operating Procedures Standardization (NATOPS) Flight Personnel Training/Qualification Jacket to the supporting activity flight clothing custodian before clothing is issued.

g. Receipt of material shall be acknowledged by one of the following certifications on the DD Form 1348:

(1) I acknowledge receipt of the described article/s of original allowance. I certify that I have not received similar articles.

(2) I acknowledge receipt of the described article/s covered by survey document _____. I certify that I have not previously received replacement on this survey.

The signing individual's name shall be typed below their signature on the DD Form 1348 for legibility purposes.

7. Eligibility for Permanent Personnel Status/Gear Issue

a. Must be designated a Naval Aviator, Naval Aircrewman or Naval Search and Rescue Corpsman.

b. Must be in a flying status at time of flight clothing issue.

c. Permanent issue personnel, upon transfer to another duty station involving flying, shall maintain all flight equipment, with the exception of those delineated in paragraph 7e, and carry them as part of their personal baggage.

d. Permanent issue personnel, upon separation from the Naval Service, shall turn in all flight equipment to AOMD Paraloft unless a need to retain said equipment is determined (i.e., Reserves, etc.).

- e. Items not to be transferred as permanent issue:
- (1) LPU-21 life preserver assembly.
 - (2) AN/PRC-90-2 survival radios.
 - (3) MK-124 MOD-0 flares.
 - (4) MK-80 MOD-0 flares.
 - (5) SRU-40/P Helicopter Aircrew Breathing Device (HABD).

The above five items are the property of AOMD.

8. Eligibility for Sub-Custody Personnel Status/Gear Issue

a. Sub-custody issue personnel are defined as maintenance personnel on Temporary Flight Orders (TFO).

b. Equipment for sub-custody issue are the only items maintained as shop-pool items.

c. Sub-custody issue personnel shall not be authorized to retain articles of flight clothing or flight operational equipment upon permanent change of station or separation from Naval Service.
