Subj: POLICY AND QUALIFICATIONS CONCERNING ASSIGNMENT OF
RESTRICTED BARRACKS MASTER-AT-ARMS

1. Purpose. To promulgate procedures and establish policy regarding assignment of personnel to Naval Air Station Oceana Restricted Barracks. The intent is to provide guidance and establish qualification requirements to ensure personnel assigned are mature, professional and physically capable.
2. Cancellation. NASOCEANAINST 1306.2A.
3. Background. The most effective means of ensuring Sailors are qualified to assume duties as a Restricted Barracks Master-At-Arms (MAA) is to closely screen potential personnel. This can happen only if departments and tenant commands strictly adhere to this policy.
4. Policy. Personnel considered for Temporary Additional Duty (TAD) assignment to the Restricted Barracks as MAA shall meet the following minimum requirements for military bearing and character:
 - a. Be trustworthy, dependable, mature and capable of supervising a challenging population of restricted personnel.
 - b. Have no performance mark below 3.0 on most recent Evaluation Report.
 - c. Have no record of non-judicial punishment or conviction by court-martial for previous 36 months.
 - d. Possess a valid motor vehicle operator's license.
 - e. Have no history of mental impairment/disorder, emotional instability, alcohol or drug abuse.
 - f. Be in good physical condition, within body-fat standards and receive a passing score of satisfactory or better on the two previous Physical Readiness Tests, unless medically waived.
 - g. Can not be on the Auxiliary Security Force watchbill.
 - h. Personnel assigned to fill an E-4 TAD assignment shall be in a paid, not frocked, status.



5. Action. Personnel shall be physically and mentally fit to supervise restricted personnel in a variety of assignments, take emergency action, including possible physical restraint and have the physical stamina required for any situations that may arise.

a. Personnel in a Limited Duty (LIMDU) status will be considered as long as they possess the physical and mental abilities to perform MAA duties and meet the requirements listed in paragraph 4. Approval shall be received from the Chief Master-At-Arms prior to assignment of LIMDU personnel.

b. Guarding and supervising restricted personnel carries the risk of actual physical harm in the event it is necessary to physically restrain a restricted person. Accordingly, female personnel that are pregnant shall not be considered and any female becoming pregnant while assigned as an MAA shall be replaced by a qualified individual as soon as possible.
