

MAXIMIZE YOUR TA ALLOCATION BY APPLYING NOW

Sailors with TA allocation remaining for this FY who plan to attend school in Oct, Nov or Dec, should apply for TA now, using FY03 funding. By doing so, the sailor will not tap their FY04 allocation of 12sh, or 18qh, or 18 CEU, 180 clock hours. Since FY04 is just around the corner (1 Oct), we suggest that interested individuals apply for tuition assistance now!

STUDY GUIDES FOR TESTING

Beginning 1 October, Navy College will reduce the distribution of hard copy test study guides. For DANTES Subject Standardized Tests (DSST) and Excelsior College Exams students should first go to the DANTES website to download a copy at <http://www.dantes.doded.mil/> Select Examinations, then Fact Sheets – the site will lead you to sites for the DSST and Excelsior fact sheets, which you can download freely. The CLEP fact sheets are copyright protected and cannot be accessed at this site by students. Those who need the CLEP fact sheets should email us or bring a blank disk to the office and Navy College staff will download the CLEP sheet.

COASTLINE COMMUNITY COLLEGE BRIEF

Ms. Debra Carlson will present a lunchtime brief on Coastline Community College's Distance Learning Partnership Program on September 24 at the Navy College bldg (531) in room T106 from 1230 to 1300. Following the brief she will be available until 1530 for individual counseling appointments.

- Coastline Community College offers 19 different rating related Associate degrees via distance education to Service-Members worldwide. This allows the Service-members to maximize their Military credit by awarding up to 40 semester hours for the Navy Rating and NEC. This is up to 2/3 of the degree.
- All courses are offered via CD Rom and the Internet, which allows students to work their school schedule around family obligations and work schedules.
- Coastline's Associates degrees will transfer 100% into several partner Bachelor degree colleges and Universities including Fort Hays University, Governor's State University, and University of Maryland University College, Excelsior College and Northcentral University.
- Coastline has been apart of the Navy's PACE program for more than 10 years. Any student who has taken technology based PACE courses may already have completed their residency!

- 1) IRS-1040 tax forms for 2002

- 3) A fairly current LES
- 4) Documentation of other income sources

HAVE YOU ORDERED YOUR ENGLISH COMPOSITION WITH ESSAY CLEP EXAM ?

Thursday, 9 October will be the last administration for the paper-based English Composition with Essay CLEP. The test examiner must order the exams on September 11th so interested individuals should contact the office to get their name on the list. This version of the English CLEP is mandatory for some schools in lieu of the series of college compositions classes. Reservations are accepted over the phone. (Note: Thomas Edison State College and several other SOCNAV schools prefer this exam.)

Note, first time math and English students typically need to take the college’s math and English placement tests. Visit the Navy College Learning Center or our office for materials to help prepare for these exams.

A NOTE ABOUT INCLEMENT WEATHER

All schools on base have inclement weather policies. When inclement weather strikes the colleges and universities will make an announcement regarding class cancellations. ROUTINE TESTING

Routine testing is available every Wednesday and Thursday at 0845 & 1045, in Bldg. 531, Room N102. Routine testing includes CLEP, DSST, Excelsior College Exams (ECE), the GED, and other student scheduled exams (i.e. independent study). **Students taking ECE, DSST #SE450 or SF/SG 524 must test at 0845.** Testing is free for all active duty and reserve personnel. Eligible civilians may take CLEP & DSST exams on a space available basis for a fee, CLEP - \$56; DSST - \$35. Acceptable payment for DSST exams is a money order, Credit Card or certified check made payable to Chauncey Group International, personal checks and debit cards are not accepted. Acceptable payment for CLEP is a money order or check made payable to College Level exam Program. Navy College Oceana is able to scan and provide preliminary results for almost all of the CLEP (military only) and DSST (civilian and military) exams. Students should allow 3 – 5 weeks to receive official test scores (longer for essay and speech exams). Students taking distance-learning exams are responsible for notifying their respective schools of our address and information, for taking exams in accordance to the school's deadlines and must provide contact information to the test examiner at Navy College BEFORE tests arrive. TCC Academic Support Labs



Congratulations! You got yourself registered for Fall classes, met your payment deadline, bought your books and found your classroom on the first night of class. Now you have been given the course syllabus and are maybe wondering, "What did I get myself into?" The math isn't coming back or sinking in the way you'd hoped. The writing assignments look daunting. Never fear! You have many ways to gather the academic support you need to succeed. These are services of the college you pay for with your student fees, so get the support you need to succeed.

The TCC Math Lab is staffed with friendly, knowledgeable assistants who can help you solve math problems and teach ideas from basic arithmetic all the way to calculus with differential equations. The lab has computer tutorials for some of the math classes and computer software which can be used to solve problems. The Math Lab at Virginia Beach Campus is located in Bayside Bldg B-209 (822-7176). Other labs are located at the Portsmouth and Norfolk Campuses. Can't make it to the on campus Math Lab? The staff at the Virginia Beach Campus Writing Center, a support service of the Humanities Division, offers writing assistance to students enrolled in any course in the college. Embry Riddle Aeronautical University – Associate, Bachelor & Master Degrees

Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University now offers the Aviation Maintenance Technology (FAA Type 65) series through two formats. One format is via the internet. These classes are fully accredited college-level classes that can also be used as part of a degree program. This series consists of six courses that deal largely with the theory and concepts of all aspects of airframe and powerplant (A & P) maintenance and with the problems, considerations and practices involved with maintaining an aircraft or a fleet of aircraft in an airworthy condition. The second format is an in-classroom setting at the Langley AFB Aero Club Hangar. This is a four class series that offers the chance for increased exposure to many of the questions commonly encountered during the Oral & Practical portions of the FAA exams. These classes are not for credit as they are considered Continuing Education Units (CEUs). The AMT courses are designed to provide the experienced military aircraft maintenance professional with the academic background and theory necessary to prepare for the written, oral, and practical examinations required for the FAA A & P License. Guidance is also provided in preparing the documentation necessary to obtain permission for testing. As an added incentive, Embry-Riddle will also pay your initial testing fees! Saint Leo University – Associate & Bachelor Degrees

A reminder to active duty Navy personnel – *if you have not “used up” your 12 credit hours of Tuition Assistance for the current fiscal year, you may be able to receive TA for the Fall II 2003 term. However, you will need to process your TA Application through Navy College Office before the end of September 2003, as long as funding remains.* Projected class schedules are available at www.saintleo.edu. The official class schedule for Fall II 2003 will be available at Saint Leo by September 18.

The South Hampton Roads Center of Saint Leo University offers degree completion programs for an Associate of Arts in Liberal Arts, as well as Bachelor Degrees with majors in Business Administration, Computer Information Systems, Criminal Justice, Human Resources Administration, Psychology, Religion and Sociology. During the Fall II term, more than 200 courses will be offered in the classroom and online through the Distance Learning Program. Class schedules for the South Hampton Roads Center and the Distance Learning program may be viewed at www.saintleo.edu (click on Academics, click on Schedule).

Saint Leo University students who have received their e-Lion login and password are now able to enroll in classes and make tuition payments online. This new registration service called “e-Lion” became available May 1, 2002. Through e-Lion, students may also view their grades and grade point average, obtain a working transcript, and review financial aid data. Students who have lost or forgotten their e-Lion “login and password” should go to the University’s home page, www.saintleo.edu; click on E-Links, e-Lion, and “Student’s Menu”; and then choose “forgot my login and password”. The information will be sent to the student’s Saint Leo e-mail address.

For a successful online registration, students should know their degree course requirements and the pre-requisites for courses. By registering on line, the student is financially responsible for all tuition and fees until Saint Leo University receives third party billing documents.

Students may also enroll for online and classroom courses at each of Saint Leo’s three convenient offices at Naval Amphibious Base Little Creek, Naval Air Station Oceana, or Naval Station Norfolk. Saint Leo University also offers classes on the Langley Air Force Base and the Fort Eustis and Fort Lee Army Bases.

Old Dominion University – Bachelor & Master Degrees

Using Your Tuition Assistance Wisely!

With the Navy authorizing 12 SH or four courses of Tuition Assistance (TA) for the upcoming fiscal year, how can a military student get the “most bang for the buck”. At Old Dominion University it will take a little planning to make this work. A Navy student must reserve one TA authorization for each semester – which is normally 9 SH since the University has three semesters each year. The remaining 3 SH can be used whenever you take that fourth course. Why is it important to have one TA authorization at your disposal for each semester? In dealing with state schools the TA authorization allows you to obtain in-state rates. Since out-of-state rates are three times as much as in-state rates this will make a lot of “dollars and cents” for you. Pardon the pun. The added bonus of using one TA authorization for each semester is that the second or even third course you take at Old Dominion University during that same semester will also be charged at the in-state rate. All classes must be in the computer when the TA document is processed at the Office of Finance for this to work, however with a little planning you can save “Mega-Bucks”! Yes, you have to pay for the other courses, but at least your being charged the lower in-state rate. Many people use their Veterans’ benefits to pay for the second or third course. If you don’t have Veterans’ benefits it may hurt to pay for the other courses, but at least you won’t go broke paying out-of-state rates.

COMPUTER NETWORK INSTALLATION AND ADMINISTRATION

ECPI College Of Technology is now offering an Associate Of Applied Science (A.A.S.) degree in Computer and Information Science with a Major in Information Technology/Networking, on-board NAS Oceana. In this hands on, skills centered program, which consists of 21 Information Technology related courses, students will learn to install, administer, and troubleshoot local and wide area networks, which utilize Microsoft, Novell, and Unix network operating systems. Advance classes in network security and Cisco router configuration are included in the program. Degree seeking students will have the opportunity to pursue a variety of IT certifications including: Microsoft Certified Systems Administrator (MCSA), Cisco Certified Network Associate (CCNA), and CompTIA A+ and N+ certification. Degree program graduates are eligible for job placement assistance and the on-base classes are offered at a reduced tuition cost. FIBER OPTICS INSTALLER CERTIFICATION

ECPI offers the Electronic Technician Association's (ETA) Fiber Optics Installer Certification course on-board NAS Oceana and Naval Station Norfolk. The course consists of classroom and hands on laboratory instruction in the characteristics, preparation, and installation of Fiber Optic cable. Students are instructed in the various tools and techniques utilized to splice, test, and terminate fiber optic cable. The ECPI instructor administers the Electronics Technicians Association (ETA) Fiber Optics Installer Certification examination on the last day of class. The class is taught over 4 Saturdays from 8am - 2:30pm. Upcoming class dates are: 27 September – 18 October at Naval Station Norfolk and 1 November – 22 November at NAS Oceana. Registration for both convening dates is ongoing.

Wanted: Senior Enlisted for Accelerated Bachelors Program



Do you want to complete your bachelors before retiring? If so, Southern Illinois University's (SIU) Workforce Education and Development (WED) Program may be the program for you. First, almost all senior enlisted receive 44 credits toward their degree based on their military training and experience. Second, the 41 credit general education requirement can be met by transferring in courses you've already taken from other universities or through CLEP/DANTES tests. Third, the 36 credit WED major can be completed in one year by attending classes on alternate weekends and completing independent studies courses.

In addition to obtaining a Bachelors degree, the WED program preps you for various human resource development positions in the training and development field, e.g., technical instructor, curriculum writer, training specialist, training administrator, or training manager.

SIU's WED Program has served the military for more than 25 years. There have been more than 10,000 graduates. VINCENNES UNIVERSITY

Selected as a Navy College Program Distance Learning Partnership school, Vincennes University (VU) of southwestern Indiana provides sailors a convenient way to earn an associate degree. Through a combination of college credit for Navy training, on the job experience and completion of selected VU courses, along with three distance delivery-options VU enables sailors to complete their coursework anywhere, any place, at any time.

Vincennes University will work closely with you and your Navy advisor to ensure that you receive full credit for any past college-level learning, enabling you to complete your associate degree in the least amount of time.

VU's Technology Apprenticeship Program is designed for students who have attained Journeyman or equivalent in a skilled trade and wish to fulfill the basic requirements for an associate degree. The degree provides flexibility by allowing students to receive credit for the training they received through a certified Department of Labor apprenticeship program. Students who have completed 8000-hour for their apprenticeship will receive 45 credits toward their degree - those with less than 8000-hours will be awarded credits based on the hours they have completed.

VU also has rate related degrees for AZ, ET, IC, LI, MA, PC, PN, STG, STS, YN and a general studies degree is available for all rates.

Strategies for Maximizing Tuition Assistance Dollars

- 1. Choose courses carefully – make every credit count toward your intended goal.**
- 2. Get focused on a specific goal or program early in the process.**
- 3. Prepare for school placement tests so that you can test out of all of the refresher level classes.**
- 4. Avoid duplication and loss of credit by enrolling in your degree program early in the process.**
- 5. Select classes in your concentration or major area.**
- 6. Use all of your credit sources – SMART; Testing programs, and prior college credit earned.**
- 7. Maximize the resources available– testing program; Navy College Learning Center; courses available on the Navy E-Learning Network; school and NCO counselors.**
- 8. Those on sea duty – contact us regarding use of NCPACE to supplement opportunities.**
- 9. Seek other financial assistance programs – MGIB; PELL; state grants, scholarship programs, and if needed student loans.**
- 10. Request a waiver – See the Navy College web site for waiver process.
